The men who operate the cars and have the nervewracking task of handling discontented crowds by packing them like sheep, are held so much under the whin that they dare scarcely whisper their desire to organize. Huntington himself t is known to have been coining money by the carload out of these overcrowded cars, and every man swinging wildly from a strap feels he is being cheated. Every incentive to revolt has been acutely present, but the people have not revolted. As a matter of fact they never do.
