The number of guards in and about the plants were greatly increased and all were armed with high-power rifles; the foreman and superintendents who were not allowed to hold membership in the union were also supplied with arms. Preparations were made as for a siege, large supplies of provisions and ammunition were laid in, and sleeping quarters were constructed for the guards and scabs.

In the meantime a strike was called to force the inauguration of collective bargaining. 2,000 of the 2,500 employees peacefully refrained from working and left the details of securing their demands in the hands of the union officials. As regards the Center, our tactics must be to separate the revolutionary elements by pitilessly criticising the leaders. Absolute separation from the organization of the Center is necessary at a certain phase of development.
