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in the present moments. Where is the Communist Party of Honduras in struggle for the parcial demands of the proletariat and the peasantry. The Party has not yet found it necessary to explain to the masses the its leading role in these struggles for parcial demands, linking these up with its final aim, for the ~~revolution~~ anti-feudal and anti-imperialist revolution.

2. The Communist Party of Panama, which since its inception, suffers from "laborist" and "Turnerist" influence in its ranks, hides its face in the present moments when the tenants strike in the city of Panama takes on greater and greater proportions and becomes more militant. The Communists who so heroically fight for the demands of the tenants in the Tenants League, have done all in their power to hide the leading role of the Party in this great strike, even to the extent that it is to be found in the leaflets of the tenants League categoric statements that the Communist Party of Panama has nothing to do with the Tenants League, that it acts independently of the Communist Party etc. Even more, the CP of Panama saw itself "forced" to suspend the First of August Demonstrations in order not to "hurt" the strike which was in its inception in those days. This dangerous attitude of the Party comes about as a result of the failure to fight mercilessly against petty bourgeois influence which for many years finds comfortable room in its midst, the "Turnerist" and "laborist" ideology.

3. When the toiling masses of Colombia find themselves on the eve of a war which is being feverishly prepared by the bourgeois-landlord governments of Columbia and Peru, the Communist Party of Colombia opposes the war with the slogan of the proletarian revolution, the overthrow of capitalism. This demonstrates in the clearest manner the lack of understanding in the leadership of the Party as to the next task of the revolution in Colombia, the anti feudal and anti imperialist revolution, a lack of
