SUPPLEMENT TO THE CIRCULAR OF THE BUREAU ON THE PREPARATIONS FOR THE FIFTEENTH ANNIVERSARY OF THE OCTOBER REVOLUTION.

TO THE CCs OF THE CPs OF THE CARIBBEAN:

Dear Comrades;

In the circular of the Bureau regarding the preparation of the 15th Anniversary of the October Revolution, we indicated in a general manner of how the Communist Parties of the Caribbean had to concretise the lessons of the October Revolution thru the amplest popularization of the experiences of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union, for EACH COUNTRY, and for EACH PARTY IN THE PRESENT STAGE OF THE STRUGGLE. The same circular underlines also the task of how to utilise the 15 Anniversary campaign to STRENGTHEN ALL FORMS OF MASS WORK, strengthen the Party in the factories and among the agricultural workers on plantations and haciendas, improve radically our work in the reformist unions and among the unemployed, intensify our activities among the toiling peasantry.

The concretization of the lessons and experiences of the October Revolution in the present stage of our struggles in the Caribbean presupposes in the first place the clear and definite understanding of the agrarian and anti-imperialist revolution in the Caribbean which is the next historic task of our movement which victory we shall be able to reach only on condition that the proletariat conquers the hegemony over the peasantry, the oppressed nationalities and the poor sections of the petty bourgeoisie of the cities, as the fundamental prerequisite for the development into the proletarian revolution. But this shall only be possible if the vanguard of the proletariat, the Communist Party, follows determinately a proletarian class line, independently of any influence hostile to the proletariat, his interests and the revolution. Consequently, in all of our daily struggles, the Party should have as aim the independent struggle of the toiling masses under the hegemony of the proletariat, struggling implacably against all kinds of bourgeois
