If we want progress to acellerate its march, in our Republic, it is necessary that all, absolutely all laborers organize. That is why we insist on the organization of electricians, carpenters, business employees, etc.

It is easy to understand that criticism is addressed to the majority of masons that integrate "The Metal Trade Council" of the Canal Zone. With founded reason and for many years this organization has been accused of managing the interest of the laborers of that sector with an imperialistic desire that honors the vile school of the totalitarians.

We want to state that we do not aggree with the congratulations given to the Panamanians for it is not true that laborers on the Canal Zone are in their majority our countrymen. All nations of the world are represented on the Canal Zone. That is why, in our opinion the felicitation should have been universal.

From Masonic Selection we form the following principle: The inalienable right of the people that contributes to its happiness, rate high above the oath of secret organization and the unconfessed ambitions of all politicians.

Interdected Democracy

During a visit to the Canal Zone of Vice President of the United States, Mr. Henry H. Wallace, Mr. Noel Austins handed this high American representative, a sheet of revindications with the following questionnaire:

"1. What is to be done with 10,000 old West Indians brought under contract and who are to be retired from the Canal Zone, when there exists the probability that they will be repatriated to their homelands, leaving children and grandchildren who do not desire and cannot be taken to such islands?

"2. What is to be done with approximately 30,000 young men and women born on the Canal Zone of parents of forbidden immigration, who because of changes in the Constitution of the Republic of Panama, are denied their acknowledgement as Panamanians and consequently cannot be employed in the Republic when unemployed or even when there is scarcity of employment on the Canal Zone?

As a solution to those worries it is suggested that residential suburbs be constructed for retired employees allowing them to live among their relatives, even after the beneficiary has died. That such suburbs be constructd where residents may have the opportunity of cultivating fields. That such guarantees be made extensive to employees "alien" to the Army and Navy Service; that persons born on the Canal Zone and studying in North America, be permitted to work during their permanency over there as well as freedom to emigrate to that country. They claim also for standard salaries on the Canal Zone, conforming to existing regulations in the United States.

In our opinion, the West Indians claim for revindication is just. We remember reading, several times in local newspapers, that fortunate Americans were granted retirement and considered as "old timers." That is a privilege no one can take from them but West Indians are also "old timers" and we understand that when they are granted retirement, the sum allowed is so insignificant that they can hardly pay for the apartment they rent. becoming a burden to our Panamanian society and for the whole nation to whom they never dedicated their energies and muscles of steel.

For many years they sweated over the hard labor of the Canal, to achieve a gigantic task of these modern times, the Panama Canal.

The democratic doctrine states that democracy is all for humanity. Once in a while we have a proof of this democracy. Will there be a demonstration of it for the West Indians?
